## Volunteers key to Second Helpings

From just one local organization, more than 4,000 meals are sent out daily to 85 different places like homeless shelters and pantries. The goal is to send out 5,000 meals every day and 1 million annually.

Second Helpings, whose motto is Transforming lives through the power of food, is that organization. It was started in 1998 by three chefs who saw a need to curtail food waste. Second Helpings has a three-part mission: food rescue, hunger relief, culinary job training.

"It's more than just nourishing our bodies," said Adriane Rios, manager of volunteer services. "It's kind of nourishing your soul on a deeper level."

Southport High School family and consumer sciences teacher Raye Jordan was looking for volunteer work in the fall of 2016 when she ran across Second Helpings, which needed help on Thursday evenings. Her church only offered volunteer programs during the day, and that didn't fit into Jordan's time schedule.

It wasn't long before she was taking her students. "It's got a little special place in my heart," Jordan said, "because I know that we're giving back and helping those who need it."

Southport is one of many schools that has students who volunteer at Second Helpings; however, Southport is the only school whose students volunteer monthly, according to Rios.

The agency is a volunteer-driven organization in Downtown Indianapolis with 28 staff members and about 750 volunteers. Volunteers rescue food that would be thrown away by restaurants and stores, prepare meals, deliver food, man the front desk, do laundry and even tend to the garden.

Volunteers have the opportunity to go through the whole process of Second Helpings, starting out with rescuing the food and ending with delivering it to places in need. The majority of volunteers spend their time in the kitchen, but if there is a need for a delivery driver or any other position, volunteers are happy to help.

"It's always really neat when you hear of a volunteer who has rescued the food; they've been in the kitchen; they've prepared the food; then they've also delivered the food," said Rios, who can be emailed at adriane@secondhelpings.org for more information. "I think they get a much richer volunteer experience that way."

Rios said she enjoys having student volunteers from Southport. Each person who comes in a group on Thursday has the opportunity to bring their friends with them. Rios says there have been students who have come on a Thursday and returned Saturday with their friends for an orientation program.

Jordan is open to bringing anyone who wants to go with her. She enjoys watching students use their cooking skills to help others and give back to the city. Jordan has noticed that students are typically quiet on the way to Second Helpings, but on the way home they have plenty to talk about.

"Usually when the kids leave they're ready to go back," said Jordan, who can be contacted at rjordan@perryschools.org. "It makes you feel really good that you can do something to help others."

## Perry Township names valedictorians, salutatorians

We are in the homestretch. In two days we will witness the commencement of approximately 990 students from Perry Meridian and Southport high schools. It's been a year to remember as our students and staff have shown incredible strength and perseverance. We are honored to celebrate their successes.

Perry Meridian and Southport have announced their valedictorians and salutatorians.

Raul Moreno tops Perry Meridian's senior class with a 4.63 GPA – a remarkable achievement for anyone, especially a student who spoke no English when he arrived in Perry Township when he was 5. Despite the challenge of learning a new language, Raul thrived.

He has competed in cross-country, swimming/diving, track and volleyball and has been active in the Creative Writing Club, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, National Honor Society and Blue Crew. He served

as class president in student voice for the past two years.

Moreno plans to study astrophysics at Indiana University as a Wells Scholar. The honor is awarded on the basis of merit and provides tuition, academic fees and a living-expenses stipend for four years.

Perry Meridian's salutatorian honor belongs to David Seals, who earned a 4.58 GPA. He is a four-year member of the varsity tennis team and orchestra and is active in Key Club, Blue Crew and Math Club, where he earned a first place this year. He plans to study aeronautical and astronautical engineering at Iowa State.

Southport has named Kaylie Turner as its valedictorian. She has 4.76 GPA and a record of achieving excellence in the most rigorous courses. She is the first student in Southport's history to be named an Indiana Academic All-Star, a distinction that recognizes seniors who excel in the classroom and take on leadership roles in their schools and

communities.

Turner is president of the Riley Dance Marathon and served as a member of the 4-H Foundation's state committee. Her next adventure awaits at the University of Mississippi, where she intends to study economics and Spanish with a concentration in pre-law.

Kelsey Andreis, who earned a 4.72 GPA, is Southport's salutatorian. She was placed in our district's gifted and talented program during her early elementary years. She goes out of her way to help with community events, including watching preschoolers during meetings, selling T-shirts for a fallen officer and leading school fundraisers.

Andreis plans to study neuroscience at IU.

We are proud of the students who will walk across the stage this week, as well as the scholars who are on the path to do the same in the future. We look forward to celebrating graduation at 6 p.m. Friday at Southport and 8 p.m. at Perry Meridian.

Since our table was so far from the performance area, I felt that on occasion that Carly might need to know that we were being properly entertained. So when she sang a song that Lyn and I were familiar with, we felt compelled to sing along. I think I did a bang-up job with "Me and Bobby McGee."

I have been out in my little office for a while now and it is Sunday afternoon. I turned the radio on to listen to the Indy 500. Moments after the national anthem was performed, I heard the Stealth Bomber flying over our neighborhood. Stuart and I rushed out to catch a peek. Very special.

I'm back. I met Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Cosby and Mr. and Mrs. Tim Smart at Schneider's Pub on Meridian Street. We enjoyed a great lunch and exchanged some stories, and we even watched the race on occasion.

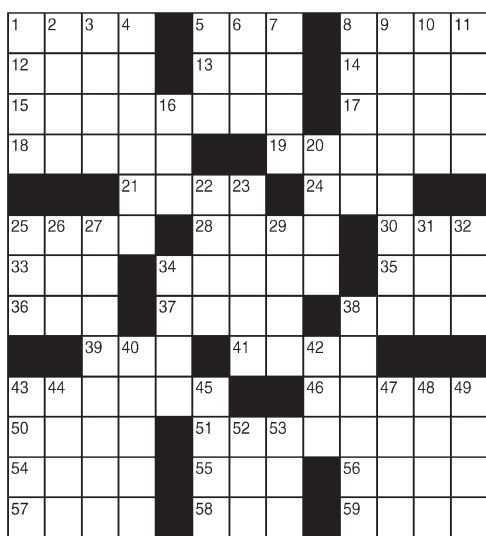
I hope everyone had a special Memorial Day. The best place to enjoy Memorial Day is Indianapolis.

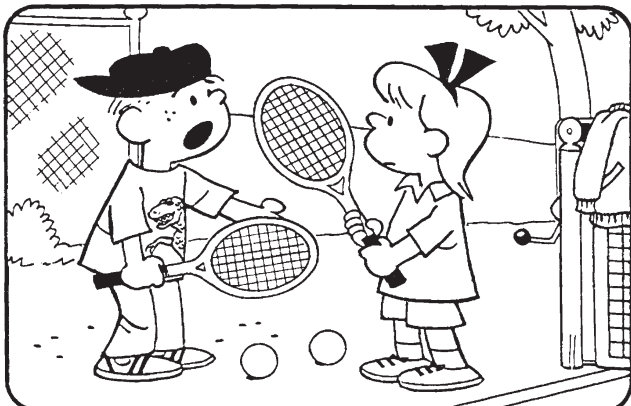

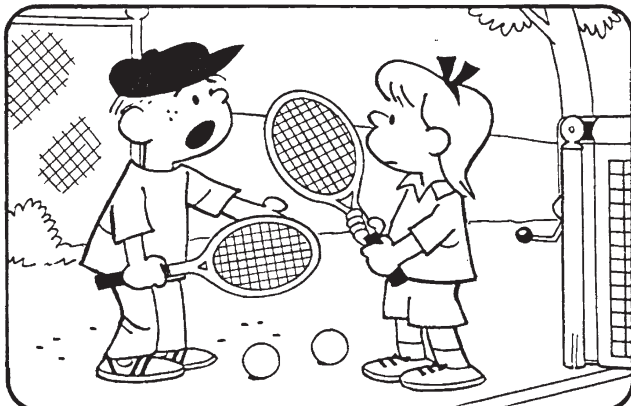

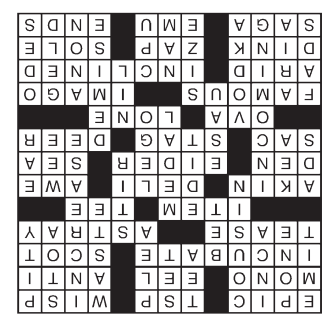

## Flashes end sectional drought; Rebels win 14th title

In an improbable matchup for a baseball sectional championship Monday night, Franklin Central entered the Whiteland sectional with a five-game losing skid against Greenwood, which had only won six regular-season games.

Franklin Central prevailed for coach John Rockey with his first sectional championship in his final season at the helm with a 10-5 win over the Woodmen. The Flashes reached the finale by defeating Martinsville 6-3 earlier Monday. Greenwood took the long way by upending host Whiteland 4-1 behind pitcher Jordan Martin on May 23 and Franklin with timely hitting from senior Cameron Crick in the semifinal.

"There's no question our draw helped us, but we came into the sectional with two good pitchers, so I knew we had a chance," Rockey said. "We thought going in that we were strong on the mound and behind the plate, but we weren't always solid at the plate."

Senior pitcher Kameron Leach got the win against the Artesians, and junior hurler Cade Fitzpatrick, who homered in the semifinal, pitched the nightcap and allowed only three hits while striking out 11.

Flashes junior Jared Gillespie drove in two runs with a two-run ground ball in the sixth and capped the win with an RBI triple to right field in the seventh.

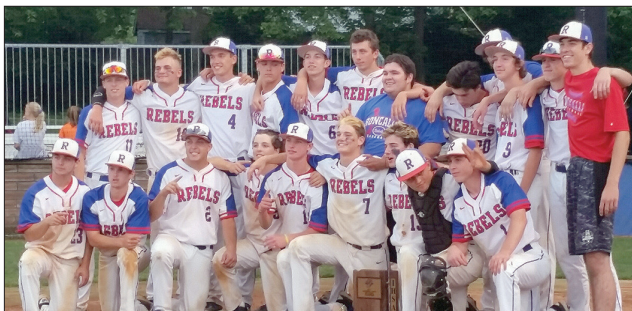
"We regained confidence to pull this one out," Gillespie said. "Our pitching came around and we got clutch hits in both games."

The Flashes (13-16) scored two runs in the fourth as the Woodmen committed back-to-back fielding errors. Greenwood (8-19) retaliated with three runs in the fifth on a dropped fly ball in right field and T.J. Bass' RBI drive to left field.

FC broke it open for its first sectional trophy since 2001 with a six-run sixth as the Flashes made 11 trips to the plate.

"We ran into that one inning again that happened during the season when we always struggled," Greenwood coach Andy Bass said. "These kids could have cashed it in with the kind of season we had. They fought to the end tonight (Monday)."

The Flashes meet No. 6 Jeffersonville in the Evansville Reitz regional at 12:30 p.m. Saturday with No. 11 Columbus East and Castle in the opener; championship game is at 6 p.m.

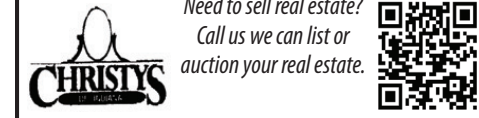

## Team was poised for top-10 finishes

For most of the 102nd Indianapolis 500, team owner Dennis Reinbold could see Dreyer & Reinbold Racing drivers Sage Karam and J.R. Hildebrand in position for top-10 finishes.

Longing for a 500 win, the veteran team owner witnessed Karam's rise from 24th starting position to sixth after 150 laps in the No. 24 WIX Filters/DRR Chevrolet and Hildebrand's drive from 27th to fifth midway in the race with a different fuel strategy in the No. 66 SalesForce/DRR Chevrolet.

Karam, who avoided three accidents, found himself in a sliding car in the fourth turn on Lap 154 and struck the outer wall for 28th place. "It just snapped around," Reinbold said of Karam's accident. "He said the car had not felt like that all day. It's disappointing because he was up to seventh and was in position to move up."

In his fourth consecutive 500 for DRR, Karam later said he may have had a cut rear tire.

"We had a car to race into the top five," Karam said. "I feel badly because the DRR crew worked so hard to prepare a good machine this month. Then this happens. I love Indy so much and now my race ends like this. I know I want to come back here next year and race hard again."

Hildebrand pitted on Lap 168 and soldiered to 11th place, making DRR the seventh different team among the top 11.

"Obviously, we aren't happy with 11th," said Reinbold. "He (Hildebrand) had some great restarts and drove hard all day."

### Byrd team

The return of Jonathan Byrd Racing turned from optimism on the night before the 500 to disappointment on race day.

Driving the No. 33 JBR Chevrolet, James Davison started 19th and encountered handling problems from the get-go. On Lap 48 he drove high into Turn 1 and was struck by 2017 race winner Takuma Sato. Davison finished last.

Team principal David Byrd II said one night earlier that the crew had found the right combination that enabled Davison to qualify 19th on Pole Day after being on the bubble on Bump Day.

The Byrd family expects to return to the 500 next year and continue the racing legacy of the late Jonathan Byrd, a Greenwood native.

### Rossi's drive

No driver has won the 500 from the last row, but 2016 winner Alexander Rossi was in the final eight-lap, five-driver duel that unsuccessfully challenged eventual winner Will Power.

Driving the No. 27 NAPA Auto Parts Honda, Rossi was 26th after 10 laps, 12th after 73, third after 160 and led Lap 173 before making his last pit stop. He finished fourth, 5.223 seconds behind Power.

Inaugural winner Ray Harroun in 1911 and Louis Meyer in 1936 each started 28th; Johnny Rutherford started from 25th before winning in 1974.

Team Penske's winnings with Will Power were \$2.5 million from a \$13 million-plus purse as announced at the Victory Banquet Monday.
