WAYNE TOWNSHIP - The chock full of the state's best players, all of whom had just graduated from their respective high schools. They did indeed.

That combination, plus the MVP effort of Mount Vernon (Fortville) quarterback Gehrig Slunaker, enabled the South All-Stars to post a 14-0 victory on a damp, but warm night.

Despite overcast skies and a few light rain showers, the contest drew 6,738 fans, according to game stats. They saw all the players, as each possession brought new units on both offense and defense.

"We knew it was possible," Warweg said of the shutout. "I'm happy it came to fruition. It was against good performers. Everybody did their part."

Indianapolis' southside was well represented, including Newlin, Warweg, Center Grove defensive tackle Owen Green, Daniel Adams, an inside linebacker from Whiteland and Lutheran teammates Jake Pasch, an outside linebacker and strong

safety, and defensive tackle Christian Pulliam. Whiteland coach John Preston was a member of the South coaching staff. Pasch was among the South's leading tacklers with four solo stops and one assist. Also contributing were Decatur Central teammates Chaikou Diallo, a free safety, and Foster Wertz, an offensive lineman.

For the record, Slunaker threw two touchdown passes: 29 yards to Dahya Patel with 4:47 remaining in the first quarter, and 16 yards to Rory Heltsley. The latter capped a seven-play, 67-yard drive that took just 90 seconds to reach the end zone with 37 seconds left in the first half. The North had blocked the conversion kick after the first TD, but Slunaker threw a two-point conversion pass to Eli McDurmon after the

second score for what proved to be the final margin. Slunaker, headed for Georgetown (Kentucky), went 15-21-1 for 158 yards and the two touchdowns.

The Southsiders were pleased with the overall effort. "You only get three days to practice, so you can't get crazy," said

For those looking for a great job with good pay, flexibility and no experience needed, look no further. Perry Township Schools is looking for substitute teachers for the upcoming school year, which begins on Wednesday, July 27.

Kelly Services staffing company is working with the district on hiring. On Tuesday and Wednesday, Kelly Services held a hiring event at Perry School's Academic Center. More than two dozen stopped by to express interest in an opportunity.

Subs earn \$110 a day and are eligible for benefits through Kelly Services. Subs also can pick up as many or as few days per week they'd like to work. They can choose which age group they want to work with and there is flexibility on when they arrive.

MADISON NOW OPEN!

Bridge crews restored traffic across the brand-new Madison Avenue bridge over I-465 this past weekend to one lane in each direction. All four lanes of Madison Avenue and the sidewalks along the bridge are expected to fully open later this week.

Madison Avenue is the third of five I-465 overpasses the I-69 Finish Line project has replaced. The new bridges will provide safe travels for many decades to come and make room for future I-465 lanes on the southwest side of Indianapolis.

Carson Avenue, just west of I-65, is the fifth I-465 overpass to be replaced. It's expected to close on Sunday, July 24 for about six months. The detour follows Keystone Avenue and Thompson Road.

I-465 traffic should continue to expect nighttime lane closures and intermittent traffic stoppages near the bridgework. Crews expect to close the right lane of I-465 eastbound on Wednesday night near the Carson Avenue overpass and the exit to I-65 southbound.

The Mann Road and Thompson Road intersection and the on-ramp to I-465 eastbound have reopened. Road improvements were completed during a long weekend's worth of work.

Cranes are lifting large bridge beams into place this week for the future I-69 northbound bridge over County Line Road.
