## Nelson Avenue home renovations

to air on HGTV's 'Good Bones' Tuesday

"Good Bones" – the popular home renovation series on HGTV – will feature three homes on Nelson Avenue in consecutive weekly shows, beginning Tuesday, Aug. 4, at 9 p.m.

The shows with home renovators/hosts Mina Starsiak Hawk and partner/mom Karen Laine, also known as "two chicks and a hammer," focus on the unique community land-trust model for artist's housing in the Bean Creek Neighborhood.

"Mina and Karen are always up for a challenge; this was new to them," said Shaunta Marsh, co-founder of Big Car Collaborative. "When we approached them and they saw what we are doing in the neighborhood with art shows and night markets, they were really excited about the challenge to create homes for artists."

Marsh continued, "They had a lot of fun thinking about how an artist would use space in a home. They are artists themselves – they have a vision; they redesign and create new space. Many artists are the working poor; they may have two part-time jobs, but don't have the finances to own a home. That's why we created this program; so, they (artists) can build a financially secure future."

Marsh and husband James Walker formed Big Car Collaborative in 2014 at 1125 E. Cruft St. They are converting the 40,000-square foot Tube Factory into artspace, a café, and 24 studios for artists, including painters, musicians, chefs, quilters, furniture, fashion, craft, design, film and video, creative writing and performing arts.

Big Car Collaborative owns 16 properties, including the homes at 1121, 1147, and 1165 E. Nelson Ave., and 10 homes on East Cruft. Big Car is the site of numerous art shows, programs, and exhibitions.

A block party had been scheduled for viewing of the Aug. 4 "Good Bones" show but was cancelled due to a renewal of COVID-19 restrictions by Mayor Joe Hogsett. The show features the home renovation and community advocates Bernie Price and Dee Alderman. Price, an artist, also is the Indianapolis Archdiocese Catholic Youth Organization girls athletic director and Bean Creek Neighborhood Association board member. Alderman created a block captain program and served on the Garfield Park Neighborhood Association board.

Walker and Marsh met them at their neighborhood association meetings and the result has been impactful.

"Bernie is this dynamic, positive, and forceful woman," Marsh said. "She is so positive and has so much energy. She and Dee have supported us from the get-go. They have made important connections for us. Dee is another lovely person and deserves attention and credit."

Marsh emphasized, "When we were going to do the TV show, the two people who moved us forward in this neighborhood had to be involved. The world needs to know about people like Bernie and Dee because they are the type of people who give you hope."

The Bean Creek Neighborhood boundaries are Raymond to Troy avenues and Shelby Street to Keystone Avenue with I-65 above part of it.

Walker and Marsh approached "Good Bones" about doing the Big Car Collaborative Artist and Public Life Residency (APLR) renovation completions by Hawk and Lane. APLR is linked to larger efforts funded by a \$3 million grant from Lilly Endowment in December 2018. The program works to develop affordable housing near downtown and the Red Line transit corridor for artists who are struggling financially. The area is part of the South Indy Quality of Life plan.

"The goal is to make sure artists are valued, too, so that Indianapolis becomes a unique city that is known worldwide," Marsh said. "We don't want to lose a creative class; we want them to live here and stay here because of affordable housing."

Resident artists receive research and training support from Big Car and community partners, dedicate 16 hours to engage the public, and host open houses or art walks.

Houses in the program were formerly vacant and in disrepair.

The Big Car Collaborative, 1125 E. Cruft St., is a shining light in the Bean Creek Neighborhood east of Garfield Park. The brightly-colored building is home to many special events, including artist's shows and public gatherings that bring art to people and people to art. A 40,000-square foot building on Nelson Avenue south of Big Car is being transformed into an art gallery, café, and 24 individual studios where artists from many fields can be creative.

And that's where the "two chicks" came into the picture on Nelson Avenue.

"With these shows, the viewers will get ideas for their own homes," said Marsh of the basis for the "Good Bones" series on HGTV. "They will learn about our neighborhood (Bean Creek) and the accomplishments of Big Car and the Tube Factory because we will reach many people."

Marsh concluded, "It's a positive story; people will watch these shows and feel better about the world."

Additionally, Starsiak Hawk recently opened Two Chicks District Co., a home furnishings store and café serving beer and wine that already is a bustling gathering place at 1531 S. East St., in the Bates-Hendricks neighborhood.

## TWO EVENTS IN ONE



(SOUTHSIDER VOICE PHOTOS BY AL STILLE) Indiana State Police authorities and Greenwood city officials opened ISP's new hangar July 21 at Indy South Greenwood Airport. The facility is the new home of ISP's air patrol and special operations. The hangar is home to Bell 407 tactical and executive helicopters, Bell 206 secondary helicopter, Cessna 182 transport airplane for traffic enforcement and spotting, and a Department of Homeland Security vehicular mobile command center. The building also has a lobby, ISP offices and several workstations. Construction began in June 2019. ISP air operations were housed at Indianapolis International Airport for 55 years before moving to Greenwood. Greenwood Mayor Mark Myers praised the cooperation of ISP, the City of Greenwood, and the Greenwood Air Authority. ISP Col. Mark French explained that the location is still central in Indiana and the hangar has a large "footprint." He explained that the site also becomes a "force multiplier," if needed by Greenwood Police and Johnson County Sheriff's authorities for emergencies. After the open house ended for central Indiana media, Greenwood firefighters were seen responding to a small civilian plane that was on fire. Firefighters immediately extinguished the smoking blaze. The airport serves local and transient aircraft (jets, pistons, and turbines), two flight schools, airport rental services and two aircraft maintenance facilities.

- We are cleaning all surfaces that people touch, such as door handles, table tops, and the arms of chairs, frequently. The procedures we use to clean all of our patient care rooms are proven to kill the virus.

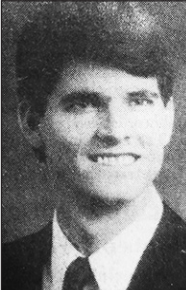

# What's in a nickname?

Separate moves are underway to change the nicknames and mascots of the Emmerich Manual Redskins and the Roncalli Rebels.

Officials at each Southside high school announced last week that they are looking into the issue that has surfaced because those names are considered "offensive."

At Roncalli, interim president, Rev. Robert Robeson, assigned a task force to come up with a new nickname and mascot. Robeson made the announcement in a video posted online.

"The most visible signs of our identity in the past has been the nickname of our school," Rev. Robeson said. "A special task force will explore alternative names and symbols that better reflect our Catholic mission and Father Roncalli."

Robeson emphasized that the nickname "Rebels" honors the revolutionary spirit of Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, St. John XXIII. His impact upon the Vatican Council is part of the history that led to the high school's nickname.

Categorizing St. John XXIII as a rebel is "a misnomer and misses the mark," according to high school principal Chuck Weisenbach. A new nickname is being sought that would better honor the life and ministry of Roncalli.

"The confusion and negative

connotations attached to the nickname 'Rebels' are also a source of concern as we move forward over the next 50 years," said Terese Carson, vice president for institutional advancement for the high school.

Robeson expects the task force this summer to include RHS students, faculty, and staff and alumni, parents, and board members.

Robeson recently was appointed interim president after longtime head Joe Hollowell retired at the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Rev. Robeson also continues as pastor at Holy Name Catholic Church and School in Beech Grove.

At Manual, new executive director Sarah Weimer seeks a nickname and mascot change in talks among the high school's alumni association, Indianapolis Public Schools, Southside residents, any local Native Americans. IPS recently approved a district-wide racial equity policy.

The nickname review follows the national fallout of a renewed uproar over the Redskins nickname of the National Football League team in Washington.

Manual was under a state-mandated takeover in 2012 as a charter school that was returned to IPS last year when a state board turned down a request by a different group to manage the high school. Christel House assumed management of Manual on July 1.

Manual has been known as the Redskins since the 1890s.

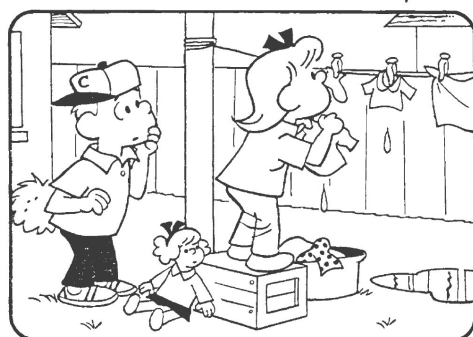
